MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING ON NOVEMBER 11, 2025

The Mahoning Township Supervisors held their regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday, November 11, 2025 at approximately 6:05 p.m. immediately following the 2026 preliminary budget meeting in the meeting room of the Mahoning Township building located at 4538 West State Street, Edinburg, PA 16116.

ROLL CALL was taken by Jean Greco, Secretary/Treasurer. Yeropoli explained that Chairman Gary Pezzuolo was not in attendance as his mother had passed away. He further noted that Theresa “Dolly” Pezzuolo had served our Township as secretary and various other positions including the annual elections

Members present were: Mark Sackin and Vito Yeropoli. Also present were Solicitor Lou Perrotta, Engineer Gregg DelPrincipe, and Police Officer Jeremy DeWitt.

Yeropoli asked for any guest speakers – there were none; however, Yeropoli noted that resident Joseph Sallman inquired and is needing to talk with Solicitor Perrotta in regards to the current Solar Ordinance.

Yeropoli asked for a motion to adopt the **MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 14, 2025** monthly meeting which was seconded by Sacking with a vote of all in favor. Yeropoli made a motion which was seconded by Sackin with a vote of all in favor for Greco to **PAY THE BILLS** as prepared by Greco since the last month’s meeting. Yeropoli made a motion to **PAY THE PAYROLLS** as prepared by Greco since the last month’s meeting which was seconded by Sackin with a vote of all in favor.

Yeropoli asked Greco for any **ANNOUNCEMENTS and CORRESPONDENCES** in which Greco noted as in other years the Sweet Pea Patch asked if the Township building could be an emergency evacuation site for their daycare. The supervisors were in agreement with this.

Greco gave the report for Township **ZONING** which there were permits issued for a demolition permit for a mobile home, reissue of a wheelchair ramp, an electrical upgrade to Dollar General, and a solar panel. Sackin noted 3 items for **PLANNING**. First was a **RATVASKY SUBDIVISION** which Yeropoli made a motion, seconded by Sackin and a vote of all in favor. Second was the **LINDY LAND DEVELOPMENT** which DelPrincipe noted the County was meeting on the next day. Yeropoli made a motion to accept contingent on the County comments which Sackin seconded and a vote of all in favor. Last was the **ARENA SUBDIVISION** which would be reviewed next month

Fire Chief Exposito noted 28 calls for November. Officer DeWitt gave the **POLICE DEPARTMENT** report with 90 calls for the month of October.

Yeropoli asked for any **UNFINISHED BUSINESS** in which Sackin noted his crew is getting ready for the snow.

Yeropoli asked for **NEW BUSINESS** in which Greco noted several annual items. **RESOLUTION 2025 - 3 ANNUAL MMO FOR UNION EMPLOYEE DEFINED BENEFIT PLAN** which Yeropoli made a **MOTION** and Sackin seconded with a vote of all in favor. **RESOLUTION 2025 – 4 MMO FOR POLICE PENSION PLAN VIA PMRS** which Yeropoli made a **MOTION** and Sackin seconded with a vote of all in favor. **RESOLUTION 2025 - 5 LOCAL SHARE ACCOUNT STATEWIDE GRANT** which Yeropoli made a **MOTION** and Sackin seconded with a vote of all in favor. **RESOLUTION 2025 – 6 ANGELO HILLSVILLE ROAD** involving a private septic and the sale of this home which Yeropoli made a **MOTION** and Sackin seconded with a vote of all in favor.

Yeropoli asked for other new business in which there was none.

Yeropoli opened the meeting back to the residents for discussion. “Poncho” Exposito expressed concern of the intersection of State Route 422 and 551 where a light has been down for some time. Yeropoli noted that attempts to access funding to replace this light have been made starting with Marla Brown and higher up’s in the Department of Transportation.

Joe Sallman noted concerns of Sky Hill and Route 224; and Sackin noted Route 422 and Baird Road with trucks getting stuck.

Yeropoli noted the **NEXT MEETING** as the **FINAL 2026 BUDGET MEETING** will begin at 5:45 p.m. on December 9, 2025 followed by the regular meeting.

At 6:18 p.m., Yeropoli made a motion to **ADJOURN** which was seconded by Sackin with a vote of all in favor.
